Direct the provision of home care services necessary to meet the needs of clients in Franklin County and bordering counties within a 20 mile radius. Duties includes: planning, implementing and directing day-to-day home health operations; financial management; maintaining compliance with professional, quality and regulatory standards. Responsible for the coordination of client care and agency services in collaboration with other agencies and all disciplines. Assess staff performance, evaluate staff skills and provide/arrange education for staff. Act as a preceptor for new staff. Working knowledge of State and federal laws relating to public health and general knowledge of Medicare and Medicaid is essential.

Ability to plan, coordinate, and supervise the work of others and to present findings, comments, and opinions clearly and concisely in oral and/or in written form; ability to exercise good judgment in appraising situations and making decisions; ability to plan and execute work effectively and to deal tactfully with the public and other health professionals.

Requirements: Master's in Nursing and three years of Public Health nursing experience (including one year of experience in a supervisory capacity); or graduation from a four-year college or university with a B.S. in Nursing which includes a Public Health Nursing rotation and four years of Public Health nursing experience (including one year of experience in a supervisory capacity); or a Master's in Public Health and graduation from a school of professional nursing and three years of Public Health Nursing experience (including one years of experience in a supervisory capacity); or graduation from a school of professional nursing and five years of professional nursing experience four of which must have been in Public Health (including one year of experience in a supervisory capacity); or an equivalent combination of training and experience.

Necessary Special Qualification – A current license to practice as a Registered Nurse in North Carolina by the NC Board of Nursing.
